

What does a Wedding Planner Do? In general, a Wedding Planner/Consultant can provide the following services:




- 1. Listen carefully from the very beginning to learn your wedding vision, and then be your advocate for realizing your dream in the best way possible.

- 7. Serve as a referee, friend, budget advisor, etiquette expert, shopper, detailed manager and organizer.








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The Tux was inspired by the traditional scarlet English hunt coat.


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












Words of Advice

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



- 1 cup chopped onions
- 2 stalks celery, chopped
- 1½ pounds ground pork
- 1½ pounds ground beef

- 1 (3 pound) whole cooked chicken, deboned and shredded
- 3 (14.5 ounce) cans whole peeled tomatoes with liquid, chopped
- 1 cup ketchup
- ½ cup hickory flavored barbeque sauce
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 teaspoon hot sauce to taste
- 1 green bell pepper
- 3 (14.75 ounce) cans cream style corn

Directions Instructions Checklist

Step 1

Heat the olive oil in a large skillet, and saute the onions and celery until soft. Mix in the pork and beef, and cook until evenly browned.

Do not drain.

Step 2

Transfer the pork and beef mixture to a large stock pot over low heat. Stir in the shredded chicken, tomatoes and their liquid, ketchup, and barbeque sauce. Season with salt, pepper, and hot sauce. Place the whole green pepper into the mixture. Cook, stirring occasionally, 2 hours, or until thickened.

Step 3

Stir the cream style corn into the stew mixture. Continue cooking 1 hour, or to desired consistency. Remove the green pepper; chop and return to the stew or discard.

- 400g caster sugar








